Many of our students come from economically disadvantaged homes and are unable to purchase these supplies. The average teacher spends over \$600 of their own money to equip their classroom each year. One of our goals is to ensure that no teacher needs to buy those classroom supplies. Every year Adopt-a-Class collects classroom necessities to fully equip our local elementary classrooms. The 2025/2026 school year begins August 1. See the attached list for the teachers' most requested needs. Most supplies collected in Rarity Bay will go to Vonore Elementary School. If we have an abundance of any items the surplus will be donated to our newly adopted Philadelphia Elementary School in Loudon County.
